Jon Petersen, PSGM, Membership Chairman for the Sovereign Grand Lodge is scheduling visitations to Lodges in New Mexico sharing the benefits of belonging to the Independ Order of Odd Fellows. He has already visited the lodges in Hobbs/Lovington and Alamogordo. He will be visiting the Albuquerque Lodges on January 11, Santa Fe on the 13th of January, Deming on January 26 and Clovis on January 28.

Brother Petersen advised that in the past, the SGL membership person or group of persons would set up a seminar type meeting in one city or lodge in a state or neighboring state, and the interested members would have to travel to attend. Usually the ones who attended were the heads of the Order or the jurisdictional officers. Maybe the message would get to the individual lodges and maybe not. It was like "preaching to the choir"; the ones who needed to hear the information did not get the message.

His philosophy, today, is that we need to talk to the members, the grass roots of our lodges and make sure everyone understands the benefits of belonging to the Order. We need to give everyone the tools they need to ask their friends, family or acquaintances to become members and what to say when they are asked—"what are the Odd Fellows?"

The structure of the meetings are up to the lodges, but he prefers an open meeting inviting all Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, prospective members or anyone who has expressed an interest in learning what Odd Fellows are about. He will be bringing information, and literature about the projects and programs of the Order and will be available to answer any questions that are presented to him.

Brother Petersen served as Sovereign Grand Master in 2002-2003 and was living in Arizona at the time, however he and his wife, Joy, now live in Arkansas, except for the winter when they live at Casa Grande, AZ.

Grand Master, Doris and President Shirley encourage everyone to attend one of these membership meetings. It can only help to educate and inform our members in making them active ambassadors in promoting our great Order to the community. > From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember.

- The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.
- Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- Three French hens stood for faith, hope and love.
- Four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke & John.

- Five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament

- Six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership and Mercy.
 - Eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

- Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit – Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self Control.

- Ten lords a-leaping were the 10 commandments.
- Eleven pipers piping stood for the 11 faithful disciples.
- Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the 12 points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.





Complete schedule will be distributed after 1 January 2016 upon the completion of the bus and cemetery shuttle scheduling. As in the past, jurisdictions may purchase one (1) wreath per jurisdiction for presentation by up to four (4) persons.
